O'Neal Church of God Southwest Indian Missies O'Neal Church of God Mission Trip to Gallup, New Mexico



Are you looking for a "Third World Missions Trip" that requires no passport and possibly no flights? Then look no further than SouthWest Indian Ministries. As you minister, make sure you schedule a day off to make a day trip out of the "Painted Desert," "Petrified Forest," and "Grand Canyon."

Read as Bishop Tim McConnell (Chairman of the South Carolina World Missions Board) shares his story about the trip O'Neal Church of God took in the Summer of 2018. The O'Neal Church of God sent a 17-person Mission Team to Gallup, New Mexico, August 19-24, led by Bishop Tim McConnell. Thanks to Brother Tapley for allowing our team to stay at the SWIM Center while we were there.

Before the Mission Trip to New Mexico in August, O'Neal Church of God held monthly Mission Fundraisers to raise money to take to New Mexico to bless several pastors in the area. The funds were to be used as needed for their churches and in their community outreach. Each member of the mission team raised their funds to pay for their way to go on the trip, including travel expenses and meals.

During our last visit, Larry and Davanna Driggers, Pastors at Bluewater Pentecostal Church of God American Indian Mission Church, needed us to cut, split, and load firewood and deliver it to widows and shut-ins. We spent a day evangelizing on the Navajo Indian Reservation, distributing the Care Bags for adults and children that we put together back at the SWIM center. We also delivered clothes to a local clothes bank to be distributed to those in need. We attended several church services in the area.

McConnell said they continue to keep in close contact with the SWIM center and the Pastors at Bluewater to pray for their needs and support projects and needs that arise. Please continue to pray for these wonderful ministries that are committed to reaching the Navajo Nation with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Report from O'Neal Church of God Mission Trip to Huehuetenango, Guatemala





During the Summer of 2019, O'Neal Church of God sent a 12 person Mission Team with Pastor Tim McConnell to Huehuetenango, Guatemala, July 15-22. Bishop Eduardo Nieves led our group and was our guide while in Guatemala. Bishop Nieves serves as the Spanish coordinator of the State of South Carolina.

We want to thank our gracious hosts, Miguel and Noemi Orantes de Manrique. Bishop Miguel Manrique is the Northeast Territorial Overseer.

Noemi and a group helped build bathroom facilities for the congregations' use. Their next stop was another church where they helped mixed concrete for the foundations of several Sunday School rooms. They also mixed concrete for the Pastor's house.

The O'Neal Church purchased and donated a concrete mixer to use as needed in the Huehuetenango territory and also bought a headset microphone for the Children's Pastor of the Northeast Territory.



Bishop Tim McConnell and Bishop Miguel Manrique partnered up through Primos. Since then, O'Neal Church of God and Pastor McConnell have coordinated three mission trips to Guatemala with Bishop Manrique. In 2016, O'Neal learned about a pastor in need of a home, we took up an offering, and in 2019 the Pastor's house was completed. We continue to remain in touch with, pray for, and partner with Bishop Manrique to support projects and raise funds for needs in the Northeast Territory of Guatemala.


